

Oral and Poster Presentation Guidelines

Oral and poster presentations may include a wide range of topics, including wildlife and habitat management projects, research findings, data analysis and study design, new field techniques, conservation issues, land-use and wildlife planning, marine wildlife, human dimensions, education, wildlife recreation, wildlife economics, and non-game programs. Oral presentations will be grouped into thematic sessions where possible. All submissions must be presented by one of the named authors on the abstract.

Oral presentations will be scheduled for 15–20 minutes, depending on the number of abstracts received. Oral presentations will be limited to Microsoft PowerPoint: other formats (such as slides, overheads) will NOT be accepted. Please prepare your presentation using PowerPoint 2003, but if you must use PowerPoint 2007 save it in the 2003 format. This is easily done in the save options.

Please do NOT bring your own laptop for your presentation. All presenters will be expected to contact their session chair at least 4 hours in advance of the start of their sessions to pre-load their presentations onto the dedicated laptop. Acceptable media are CD and flash drive. You will need to ensure that these are compatible with our laptops, which will have CD readers and USB ports.

Poster presentations will be mounted to carpeted walls or poster boards and should be no larger than 4 ft. x 6 ft. Posters will be displayed at 6:00–8:00 pm during a reception/social in the UAF Pub on the ground floor of the Wood Center. They will then be moved to the main conference room in Wood Center for display at session breaks on Wednesday, April 8.

Abstract Guidelines

Abstracts for oral and poster presentations must be received by **March 27, 2009**. Abstracts received after this date will not be included in the program. You will receive an email receipt of your abstract. All presenters of papers and posters must register for the conference. Please follow these instructions when preparing and submitting your abstract:

- Abstracts are restricted to 250 words or fewer, excluding author information.
- Please refer to the format shown below and explained in the body of the sample.
- Please type abstract in 10 point, Times New Roman font.
- Type the title in all capitals.
- We will not be retyping your abstract so please proofread it carefully.

- Please submit the abstract as a Microsoft Word attachment using the following naming convention: Last name of first author followed by “.doc”, for example, “Smith.doc. If you are first author for multiple submissions, sequentially number each file, for example, “Smith1.doc” and “Smith2.doc”.
- Please indicate on the abstract submission whether you prefer an oral or poster presentation.

Please type your complete abstract in 10 point, Times New Roman font. Abstracts should be 250 words or less. Type the title in all capitals. Skip two lines, then type the senior author’s name (last name first). If more than 1 author, put an asterisk beside the presenting author. Skip 1 line and type author addresses. Skip 2 lines and type the text of the abstract, single-spaced, Time New Roman font type. Please spell-check your abstract before submitting.

FORMAT (choose one): Oral, Poster, Either
